1.1	Bob noted that it's been a full year since we started rolling out new IPMS Canada initiatives to increase the value of national membership. Things like: Reduced printing costs which allows us to redirect some of that surplus to other initiatives A regular e-newsletter going out to the membership New display banners and brochures have been produced and distributed Xxxxxx Vendors are helping market IPMS Canada, we are helping with their marketing, some vendors have started offering discounts to members Museum brochures have been produced and are in distribution across the country Our new Café-Press virtual store is online with the first of the IPMS Canada branded items A youth membership price was introduced Email renewal process has been refined We have started the dialogue with chapters to help them to help us to improve awareness of IPMS Canada The decline in membership has been stabilized and is starting to climb again We are exploring ways of producing our entire RT library on soft media	Info
1.2	We received a letter from member Bob Shoop of Colorado Springs. We will be supporting awards for the Best Canadian Subject and a regular junior category.	Info

1.3	We have been offered the opportunity to have our flyer placed in the US Nats goodie bag. That will total about 900 units. Question is – what do we want to put in them?	All
1.4	Bob showed an 11" x 17" drawing of a CF-100. 900 of these would cost of about \$210 plus shipping. Other ideas were IPMS Canada marketing items like trading cards, fridge magnets, door hangers (e.g., Do Not Disturb – Modeller at work). We need to reach a decision in the next month or so and have them in Colorado by early July. These might also be used for the UK Nats in Telford.	Info
1.5	To highlight some of the member confusion out there at the chapter level, Bob quoted a letter from an IPMS Ottawa member who wanted to know the difference between local and national membership. Coincidentally, Kerry Traynor recently did a 20-minute PowerPoint presentation to his own home chapter, as a way to market IPMS Canada to the locals. Clearly we can improve the information out there. CML will look at developing a national PowerPoint presentation to help chapters raise awareness and understanding of IPMS Canada and IPMS Chapter membership.	Info Kerry
